Facts

Kazakhstan declared itself an independent country on December 16, 1991, the last Soviet Republic to do so. Its communist-era leader Nursultan Nazarbayev became the country's new president. Since its independence, Kazakhstan has pursued a balanced foreign policy and worked to develop its economy, especially its chemical and petrochemical industry, ferrous and non-ferrous metallurgical engineering and agriculture.

Money

Foreign currency can be exchanged in banks, airports and *bureau des changes*. The Kazakhstan national currency is called the "tenge" (KZT).

Climate

The climate is continental, with warm summers and colder winters. Precipitation varies between arid and semi-arid conditions.

Communication

Phone: The country calling code is +7. For international calls from Kazakhstan: 7-10.

Cell Phones: In 2009, there were about 14.9 million users of mobile phones .

Broadcast Media: Kazakhstan-1 is the state television channel. Other country-wide television stations are Khabar and Yel Arna. According to government statistics, there are 116 private channels with varying coverage across the nation. American and European as well as Russian TV shows are also popular in Kazakhstan. The state owns nearly all radio and TV transmission facilities and operates national TV and radio networks. All media are required to register with the Ministry of Culture, Information and Sports, with the exception of websites.

Internet: Internet code is .kz. About 5.3 million users in 2009.

Events

Kazakhstan Independence Day is on December 16.

Others

Population: The average age is 68.51 years. About 99% of the population is literate.

Languages: Kazakh is the first official language, and Russian is the second official language – spoken by most Kazakhs.

Religion: Muslim 70%, Russian Orthodox 27%, Protestant 1%, other 2%.

Hotels: Kazakhstan has an increasing number of 5-star hotels, mainly located in the capital city Astana and the main cities (Almaty, Karagandy, Shymkent, Atyrau, Aktau, Aktobe, Kostanay, etc). Kazakh hotels are characterized by their hospitality and fair prices.

Visas

A Kazakhstani visa is not required for citizens of Mongolia, Serbia, Turkey and all former members of the USSR (except for Baltic states). Unless made from countries where requirements are eased, a visa support request should be made by an "inviting side" in Kazakhstan to the local migration police services and to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
