



The Just Like My Child Foundation has been established to tackle poverty in developing countries at the root level through

- **Health care**
- **Education**
- **Economic development and stimulation**

We do this by focusing holistic solutions on a designated community, including developing infrastructure for currently operating medical clinics; educating children with an emphasis on girl-child education; providing education to women about women's rights and health issues; and providing avenues for microfinance initiatives to families, especially women, once they are healthy enough to work. Empowering women is of extreme importance in order to effect lasting change. In many third world countries, the mothers are very pivotal to the survival of their families.

Our commitment to donors is to provide DIRECT funding to those medical facilities and communities that are already making a difference on the ground. We provide our donors with audio, video and written documentation of how their funds are being used. The bottom line is that we want you to make a DIRECT connection with the people whom you are helping.

**The Bishop Asili Clinic in Northern Uganda** serves over 600,000 people. Health care workers report that almost every household has been affected by HIV/AIDS. Either someone has died or is already sick. The clinic's needs to help stem the tide and provide relief to these people is quite minimal, yet the results would be profound:
